

This will mean that on some weeks your child's work will be seen online, but they may not get a comprehensive reply, as the teacher is teaching!

We know that you will be finding it a challenge having your children home and trying to teach them too, it will be easier if you get in a routine and stick to it! Write it out where you can all see it and use your 'timetable'. Please just do the best you can in these difficult circumstances, and be mindful that your child's teacher will not be setting a 9am-3.15pm school days' worth of work!
