Paws, Claws and Whiskers!



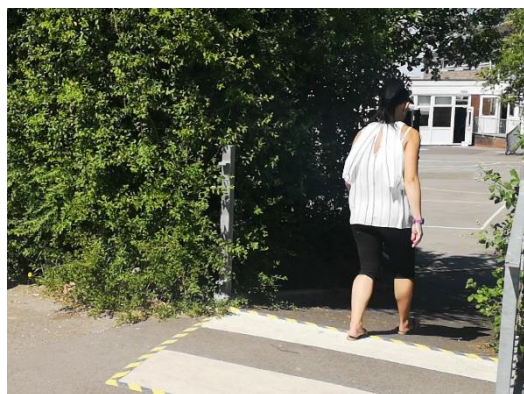
