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Dear Parents / Carers

As we started the new term this year we did so with an overnight announcement on Monday that meant we were not able to welcome you all back. We have been able to offer places for Critical workers and a small minority of other children as the guidance issued to us has allowed. We hope despite the restrictions you were able to have an enjoyably different Christmas!

I know this was not the start to the New Year any of us were expecting. Firstly I must say thank you to those of you who are working on the 'frontline' supporting critical roles in the community and also to all of you who have had to change your plans to support this, and are now helping your children to access their online learning.

Schools have been closed not because they are unsafe but because additional measures are needed to contain the spread of the virus. The wider restrictions in place as part of the national lockdown to contain the spread of the virus in the community will allow us to continue to keep the nursery open and the school for critical workers.

On the next page we there will be some advice about how to access online learning and how we can support you—you MUST ask if you need help.

I cannot tell you how important it is that your child/ren complete their learning carefully and with focus. The data shows us that many children who DID NOT complete their learning in March are now behind and will need to catch -up, so we need them to 'keep-up'.

As a parent I know this is not easy, I myself am reliant on my husband who is working from

Online Learning

As you will now be aware, work is being set for all children working at home on Seesaw. There will also be daily live sessions through Google Meet and your class low) They are at the same time each day to enable siblings sharing devices to access these without start.



The expectations on schools are different during this lockdown compared to the one in March and we thought it would be helpful if we shared these with you.

There is a greater focus on schools providing work that is in line with the planned curriculum, it is important that ALL children are accessing what their teachers provide on Seesaw.

This will ensure that they continue to make progress in their learning. The dren who are in school are also continuing with their curriculum and teachers are working very hard to make sure that what is provided online is as similar to the teaching in school as possible.

The teachers will be checking to see if the children are logging on to Seesaw to complete their work, as well as the quality of work completed. Teachers will phone families where work is not completed to see if there is something we can do to help. However, do not feel you need to wait for this phone call - please contact us through email if you require any help or are facing any problems with the online learning and we will do our best to help you.

Xbox
