## What is a beach?



### What we will learn

During this term Bumble Bee children will be learning to refer to key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, sea, ocean and key human features, including: port, harbour and shop.

We will understand that an environment or place can change over time due to a geographical process, such as erosion or human activity.

Together we will be identifying and naming a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals and exploring the different habitats they live in.

We will also be creating a mythical sea creature and learning how to use adjectives in a sentence to describe its features. Alongside this the children will create their own rhythms and poems about the beach and sea.
