## What is a beach?



### What we will learn

During this term Honey Bees class will be learning about beaches and understand that they can be made from sand or pebbles.

We will learn that the coast is different to the where we live and that sea water is salty.

-We will look at why people go to the beach and what they do there and will be trying some of these activities.

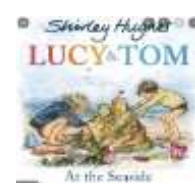
We will learn that there are a variety of sea creatures that live on the land near the coast or in the ocean. We will learn the names of some sea mammals, birds and sea creatures and know about some of their features e.g. an octopus has 8 legs, crabs move sideways and have pincers.

We will learn how to be able to ask for an ice cream and know some of the flavours.

We will understand that an exchange of money must happen when you buy an ice cream.

We will learn about some of the dangers that might be encountered at the seaside and know what we can do to stay safe. E.g. understand that wet surfaces can be slippery and that we must wear sunscreen and hats to protect us from the sun.
