Forthcoming Teachers strike/Industrial Action in Schools

Forthcoming Teachers strikes/Industrial Action in Schools

Dear parents and carers

Thank you for your supportive approach for strike days that have already occurred and thank you in advance for the upcoming strike days, declared by the NEU and supported by NAHT, NASUWT, GMB, UNISON and UNITE.

I can confirm that on Tuesday 2nd May the following classes will be;

Open

- Butterflies (Nursery)
- Otters
- Buzzards
- Badgers

Children in these classes should attend school as normal, non-attendance will be considered UNAUTHORISED.

Closed

- Dormice
- Frogs
- Kestrels
- Busy Bees
- Honey Bees
- Bumble Bees

These children cannot be supported safely in school due to staff absence.

However, like in the pandemic, we will open to some children as follows, for a childcare service, with suitable activities to meaningfully occupy the children:

- Vulnerable families who we will speak to in confidence you will be contacted if this is you!
- Front line & Patient facing emergency services families NHS, police, fire service, armed forces, social care, prison service (if you are on-shift). Please let us know if you require a place at school and your profession.
- Mead Academy Trust pupils whose parents will still be at work in our schools on the strike days to enable the childcare service to operate.

The limited service will be provided by a skeleton staff of mainly non-NEU members, the NEU being the union which has declared strike action.

Children entitled to free school meals will be able to come into school for a hot lunch on this day at 12.30, please book this with the office, so we cater for those children who will arrive. Please come to the green 'King Fisher Court Gate'. These pupils will be dismissed at this gate at apx 1pm.

We appreciate that this causes disruption, and thank you for taking time to understand the reasoning behind this national industrial action in schools.



What Parents and Carers Need to Know about Fortnite Chapter 4

If you know any young gamers, you'll almost certainly be familiar with Fortnite. It's one of the most popular video games on the planet – up alongside other mega-hits like Minecraft, Roblox and Call of

Duty in terms of its sheer number of fiercely dedicated players. Fortnite currently has more than 400 million devotees worldwide – around 25 million of whom play it every day.

Given Fortnite's relatively young user-base, though (as many as one in four pre-teens are reported to have played the game, despite its PEGI 12 age rating), it's prudent not to conflate immense popularity with absolute safety. Our #WakeUpWednesday guide assesses the latest version for potential pitfalls that parents and carers of young Fortnite fans should be aware of.

In the guide you'll find a number of potential risks such as compulsive playing, audio chat with other gamers and in-game spending.
