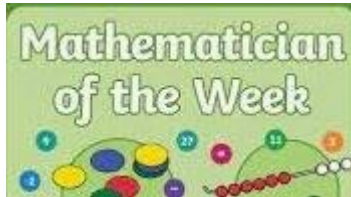

Online Safety Advice

anational online safety, we believe in empowering parents, carers and young people with the information they need to make informed decisions about online safety with their children, so they can stay safe. It's our aim to provide you with the tools you need to protect your child from online risks.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about OMETV

OmeTV is another app which encourages users to make friends from all around the world. People can search profiles by age and gender and send direct messages or photos. However, the app is primarily used for video calls. When using the feature, users are connected 1:1 (one-to-one) although only their country of origin is shared. People can then either accept or decline a video call or the next chat or can stay in chat for as long as they wish.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

STRANGER DANGER

While young people generally want to share personal information with strangers, the ability of technology to connect people from all over the world can make them feel more vulnerable and less safe. Combined with the fact that OmeTV provides a selection of filters and avatars, it can be easy for users to pretend to be someone else, which means it's likely many users will claim to be young people when they are not.

EXPLICIT CONTENT

Unfortunately, there are a lot of users who use OmeTV to share explicit content, which is not suitable for children. While users can report such content to the app, it's not always removed quickly, and it's not always clear if the reporting has been successful. Young people could easily be exposed to highly inappropriate images.

REPORTING DIFFICULTIES

When video calling, the other person's behaviour is often not monitored or reported. There is a 'Report Abuse' link at the bottom of the video, but this speed with which it can be reported can make it difficult to use the system. There is also little evidence to suggest that offenders are dealt with appropriately (through warnings, account termination, for example).

AGE VERIFICATION

Although the app states that users must be 18 or over, there's no way to verify this, and it's easy for users to lie about their age. Therefore, children may be able to get up a false account. To protect OmeTV, users simply need to prove to the app that they are who they claim to be, which means it's likely many users will claim to be young people when they are not.

VIDEO RECORDING

When young people are chatting live on OmeTV, they can be recorded by others who are using the app. This means that anything they say or do could be shared with others who are using the app. This is not always clear, and it's not always clear if the app is recording what is said or done. Therefore, users should be aware that anything they say or do could be shared with others who are using the app.

LIMITED PARENTAL CONTROLS

OmeTV has very limited parental controls. There is a 'Safe Mode' but this only restricts the content that is shown on the app. It does not restrict the number of people that can be added to a chat, or the number of people that can be added to a chat. Therefore, users should be aware that anything they say or do could be shared with others who are using the app.

Advice for Parents & Carers

FOLLOW AGE GUIDELINES

OmeTV has an age recommendation of 18 and over, which means that the app is not suitable for children. It's important to adhere to the age guidelines and to restrict access to the app for younger users. If you find it difficult to do this, talk to your child about the potential risks and explain why they probably shouldn't be using it.

DISCOURAGE CHATS WITH STRANGERS

Remind your child of the dangers of talking to strangers online. The anonymous OmeTV offers, plus its website, means it's not always clear who is on the other end of the line. Explain that you should not give out personal information to anyone online, and that you should not meet anyone in person who you have met online.

DISCUSS THE DANGERS

Maintain communication with your child about online safety and empower them to protect themselves. Simply deleting an app from their device impacts their independence and can make them feel less safe. Highlight the risks of predators targeting themselves to children on the internet and discuss what they should do if asked for explicit images.

ENABLE PARENTAL CONTROLS

Regardless of how responsible your child may be, it's essential to use parental controls on their device. It's easy for young people to get lost in cyberspace, feeling they are in control. They may not always think about the risks of online safety, and they may not always think about the risks of online safety. OmeTV is an emerging social networking app that aims to let its users connect, ideally forming new friendships or simply getting to meet interesting people from all around the world. It's not particularly new technology, but it's remained popular amongst younger audiences. OmeTV uses video chats to randomly connect its users, much like its better-known sister app, Omegle.

Unfortunately, OmeTV still carries the same risks as its competitors. With so many users being so lightly regulated, there's real potential for some unpleasant characters to make use of the app. Our #WakeUpWednesday guide dives into OmeTV, highlighting the risks and advising you on how to keep your child safe on the app.
